# Give Where You Live Collier Sets New Record to Raise Over \$6.4 Million

(NAPLES, FL – February 12, 2021) – The seventh anniversary of Give Where You Live Collier generated 2,593 donations, including 1932 made online, and raised a total of \$6,446,656\*—over \$763,000 more than last year's total of \$5,683,085. The event has brought in over \$31 million since its inception.

Hosted by the Community Foundation of Collier County and the Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation, Give Where You Live Collier, gave 40 Collier County nonprofits a much-needed boost with donations, a \$500,000 matching fund and \$50,000 in prizes.

Twelve prizes of \$4,000 each and two \$1,000 prizes were given out this year to small, medium, and large organizations (size determined by operating budget) in several categories, some by chance and some by the highest amount of donations and fund raising efforts. All prizes were announced on CFCC's Facebook Live channel.

This annual online giving campaign, the most established virtual event in Collier County, is more important than ever this year. Local nonprofits who provide vital services to our community have been hit especially hard by COVID-19 and struggle to survive due to canceled events and lost donations. Built upon the idea that everyone can be a philanthropist, this project provides an easy way to support the education and basic needs efforts of 40 nonprofits through a 24-hour online fundraiser. It reminds the community of the importance of making a difference where you live, even if you are a part-time Collier County resident.

"We are so excited to reach an all-time high Give Where You Live Collier donation record," said Eileen Connolly-Keesler, CFCC president and CEO. "We exceeded our goal thanks to the nonprofits who put in extra work to raise funds for operations to replace lost event donations and our donors who understand the impact COVID-19 has had on our nonprofits and the need for support in our community. As always, our special thanks to the Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation for making this event possible for the seventh year in a row."

The ten prizes awarded include:

**Peer to Peer \$4,000 Prize** for the organizations that brought in the most (highest dollar amount) online donations through social media fundraising from 12 pm to 1 pm EST on February 10th: Charity for Change, RCMA, and Florida Gulf Coast University Foundation.

**Golden Ticket \$4,000 Prize** (random drawing): Fun Time Early Childhood Academy, Champions For Learning, and Healthcare Network

Java Jolt \$4,000 Prize for the organizations that brought in the most (highest dollar amount) online donations from 8 am to 9 am EST on February 11<sup>th</sup>: Friends of Rookery Bay, Harry Chapin Foodbank of Southwest Florida, and YMCA of South Collier

**'A' Game \$4,000 Prize** for organizations that achieved the highest increase in donations since last year: Naples Therapeutic Riding Center, Meals of Hope, and Naples Senior Center at JFCS.

**Surprise \$1,000 Prize** for the organization that met all deadlines and followed all event rules: Grace Place For Children and Families and STARability Foundation.
